French Immersion Certificate

- Elk Island will award a French Immersion

 - Qualified students will receive certificate at our annual awards ceremony
 - Our students have the option of writing the the *Diplôme d'Études en Langues Français* (DELF) exam. The DELF is an international diploma officially awarded by the French Ministry of Education to certify the French language skills of candidates from outside of France.


Grad Eligibility Policy


MyPass STUDENTS MUST SIGN UP IN ORDER TO GRADUATE

 All students in Alberta must sign-up for a myPass account

- myPass is a direct link to Alberta Education, it allows students to:
- View and print diploma exam results
- Order official transcripts for \$10
- ✓ Apply to rewrite Diploma exams (\$26.25)
- Submit transcripts to Apply Alberta and post-secondary education

Marks & Transcripts

- Initial marks and final transcripts are pulled by most Alberta institutions from Apply AB (U of A – self report, check your institutions process)
- Updated marks throughout the year must be sent directly to each institution by the student; some now have quarterly updates
- Institutions outside of Alberta, transcripts must be ordered through myPass; \$10 per transcript; can be mailed directly to the institution

- What is Apprenticeship?
 - Partnership among employers, apprentice and government
 - 80% on the job training and 20% technical training

- What is a Journeyman?
 - An individual who has a certificate and is therefore recognized as a professional tradesperson

• • • Apprenticeship



- Find employment with a journeyman willing to train you in your trade.
- Employer (journeyman) and Alberta
 Apprenticeship Board make arrangements
 for six to eight weeks of theory training each
 year at NAIT.
- Length of time depends on the trade.
- Apprentice is an employee, earning between 40% and 80% of journeyman's wage while you learn.

Alexander Rutherford Scholarship

The government of Alberta encourages and rewards the excellence of Alberta students through the Alexander Rutherford Scholarship program.

Selection

To receive this scholarship, you must also meet all of these eligibility criteria:

- Be a Canadian Citizen, a Permanent Resident of Canada or Protected Person under
- <u>Canada's Immigration and Refugee Protection Act</u>, (Visa students are not eligible)
- Be an Alberta resident, and to be considered an Alberta resident the following conditions must apply:
 - one parent or legal guardian must have maintained permanent residence in Canada for at least 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the applicant commencing a program of study;
 - applicant has maintained permanent residence in Alberta at least 12-months prior to commencing a program of study;
 - applicant is not eligible to receive a scholarship with respect to any grade unless the applicant or the applicant's parent(s)/legal guardian were a resident in Alberta throughout the whole of that grade.
- Be enrolled in a full course load in a designated post-secondary or an apprenticeship program of at least one semester in length.

Deadlines

 Apply online when your official high school marks are available and when you are enrolled in full-time post-secondary studies.

Disbursement

- Once your enrollment or attendance has been confirmed by your post-secondary institution, Alberta Student Aid will mail a cheque to you within one month.

- You may only be awarded the Alexander Rutherford scholarship once.
