- 2. On the job, their view of the work adults do becomes sharper; they gain understanding and appreciation of the challenges people face daily along with the achievements they accomplish.
- 3. After the event, the positive effects of seeing the workplace and their parent/host in a new way may have lasting effects. In addition, students begin to think about the choices they will have to make and the path they must follow to meet career goals.

We ask that every Grade 9 student participate in this valuable opportunity. Parents are asked to arrange for your son/daughter to accompany you to your place of employment for the entire day. If it can't be a parent, it can be a Grandparent, Aunt, Uncle, or Close Friend. Students are expected to interview other employees to answer questions about the workplace. Please read and complete the accompanying forms and return them to the students CTF 9 teacher no later than *Monday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2018.*
