What is a scholarship?

A non-repayable sum of money awarded to a student to help finance further education. Most scholarships are based on merit in areas ranging from academic to athletic achievement. Other scholarships are based on financial need, leadership, personal challenges or affiliations.

What is a bursary?

A bursary is a non-repayable grant of money. Bursaries are awarded primarily based on financial need, but academic achievement may also be considered. Usually, the applicant must provide detailed documentation describing their financial institution when applying for the bursary.

Where can I find a list of scholarships and bursaries?

Students are encouraged to scan the internet for opportunities, review university sites, check with employers and community organizations which you or your family are members of.
