### Renting from the School

All students entering the band program can rent instruments from the school for a set fee. All percussion instruments are rented from the school. The fee is \$110. If students are bringing their own instrument they will not need to pay this fee.

### Purchasing Instruments

There are many advantages to students owning their own instruments. Personal instruments have not been used by anyone else. Students can get better quality instruments than the school can provide, but there are instruments out there that will just not provide an adequate playing experience.

#### If you are considering purchasing an instrument for your student:

1. Talk to Mr. Basaraba, he would love to help get you find a quality instrument that suites your need and your budget.
2. Purchase from a music store (Bandstand, St. John's, Long & McQuade...) or used. Generally places that don't specialize in musical instruments do not provide good value or a product that is of adequate enough quality.

### Home Practice

Home practice is vital for students to gain skills when it comes to playing a musical instrument. Practicing at home strengthens muscles and reinforces technique. With performance on a musical instrument, time performing is one of the main assets and the most productive ways to improve. Students are strongly encouraged to practice at home.

### A.M.P.S.

The Ardrossan Music Parents Society (A.M.P.S.) is a non-profit organization that works directly with the school to help fund and give input on decisions for the Music Program at Ardrossan Jr. Sr. High. They hold monthly. The meetings are usually only 1 hour.

AMPS is vital to the success of the music program; parent help and input are highly valued. There are elected positions and non-elected positions, all parents are welcome and encouraged to come.

### Fundraising

All forms of fundraising are optional, but participation is what makes the program able to run and can benefit students directly. Fundraising for this year has not been finalized. If there are fundraising opportunities, that information will come at a later time.

### Band Accounts

AMPS manages Band Accounts which are generated from fundraising. Students can use Band Account money for anything music related, with approval from Mr. Basaraba. Students generally fundraise to subsidize; any costs occurred when taking band. When students graduate or leave the program, their band account is transferred to a sibling or donated to the programs general funds.
