## AJSH JANUARY 2023 – TRUSTEE REPORT

## Since My Last Report:

In December 2022, the board took part in a board retreat, during which we discussed areas of focus for the year's advocacy efforts. These efforts included curriculum; infrastructure and capital projects, value of a strong public education system; funding and a continued need for mental health supports throughout the Division. As well, trustees discussed issues to bring forward to candidates from all parties running in the provincial election in May. The Board will be meeting with Jackie Armstrong-Homeniuk to discuss educational capital pressures and social-economic concerns.

On December 15, the Board approved the appointment of Brent Billy and Simon Grinde as the bargaining committee spokesmen for the upcoming local negotiations with the Alberta Teacher's Association Local. No. 28.

December 13, the Board of Trustees met with the Executive of the Employee Relations Group and on January 12 we met with the ATA Board. These meetings give us an opportunity to meet the people on these Boards and to hear any concerns they might have.

#### **Registration:**

Students returning to Elk Island in 2023-24 school year will confirm registration at their designated school or request attendance at a different school. All requests to attend a specific school or program for the next school year must be completed during the returning student registration process. Registration commences on February 1<sup>st</sup> and closes February 28, 2023.

Alberta Education has provided school councils with a \$500.00 grant. As there has been interest in pooling funds, COSC Chair Lesley Williams and Kendra Roemer are reaching out to prospective speakers to ascertain how much a speaker series or workshop would cost. They are asking school councils to notify COSC of their intent to pool funds by January 31<sup>st</sup>.

Once a school council decides what they would like to do with their grant, they can fill out and submit the online "School Council Engagement Grant Request Form." All submissions that meet the grant criteria will be approved and announced at the following COSC meeting. EIPS will complete the activity payment on behalf of the school council – simply submit the invoice to finance.submissions@eips.ca and cc Emma Small.

I would like to recognize our own Superintendent Mark Ligouri and Board Chair (for 13 years) Trina Boymook, who received the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Medal. This medal is to honour the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's accession to the throne, as the Queen of Canada. The medal is handed out to select Albertans who have contributed significantly to the province over the last year.
