- 1. Call to Order Meeting called to order at 6:42 pm by Jennie Marsh
- 2. Welcome and Introduction Thanks to Lisa Slyewka for her time as secretary and her service to the AJSH School Council
- 3. Approval of Agenda Motion to approve: Jill Herbert
- **4. Approval of Minutes** (March 17, 2025) Motion to accept minutes as written: Jill Herbert. Seconded by Amy Stroud
- **5. COSC Report** Anne Wasylyshen presented a summary of the April 2, 2025 and May 7, 2025 meetings:
- Board Report (Cathy Allen): EIPS has gone ahead with creating Campus EIPS (school name for the division's new collegiate program) despite not receiving funding to build a new collegiate school. Campus EIPS will offer programming to students at secondary schools throughout the division
- **Superintendent Report** (Sandra Stoddard): The division has been given the funding manual from Alberta Education. Important budget considerations include:

- Literacy and numeracy
- Career pathways
- Classroom complexities
- High-quality teaching and learning
- Equity: eligible classified staff have received a lump-sum payment
- Curriculum work
- Rural education
- Early learning: exploring full-time kindergarten pilot program for STEM and French Immersion
- Facilitating book club for EIPS principals to help them plan for the future
- Division looking to support school community wellness and work/life balance with initiative regarding communication
- The funding model will be moving away from the Weighted Moving Average (WMA) and will be based on a 2-year average adjusted enrolment method starting the 2025/2026 school year
- **ASCA Update**: ASCA Annual Conference took place April 26, 2025 and the AGM was April 27, 2025 (both offered solely online)
 - Education Minister Demetrios Nicolaides opened the event, Jo Phillips provided the keynote address on resilience, and Elder Wilson Bearhead joined as a special guest
 - Proposed advocacy resolutions have been published for the 2025 AGM
- **COSC Sharing:** \$483 left over from the Alberta School Council Engagement (ASCE) grant funds from Andrew School.
 - COSC members agreed to use funds to pay David Irvine for a link to access the presentation he provided for several school councils that pooled their ASCE grant funds
- **6. Trustee Report** (Susan Miller)

BUDGET

- EIPS receives >90% of total funding from Alberta Ed
- Salary and benefits = >75% of the 2025/2026 budget
- Staffing is the biggest impact on the budget

Literacy and Numeracy: EIPS will support priority through its Leveraging Student Achievement Reserve, the Reading Enrichment & Development Program, and the Literacy and Numeracy Grant Funding

Collegiate and Career Pathways: EIPS will support priority through the new Campus EIPS with ongoing focus on building and expanding Career Pathways opportunities and continued efforts to pursue a collegiate school in Fort Saskatchewan

Complexity in Classrooms:

- (a) Address learning gaps using Leveraging Student Achievement reserve funds
- (b) Build capacity through a new collaborative learning structure (beginning 25/26 school year division-wide every Wednesday)
- (c) Specialized support allocation
- (d) Two READ teachers will continue to be funded

ENROLMENT

- Majority of provincial growth has occurred in Edmonton and Calgary urban areas
- EIPS expects enrolment to decrease by approx 100 students
- Enrolment directly influences funding and program planning
- Educational Assistants Appreciation Day celebrated May 14, 2025 as a day to officially recognize the value, dedication, and commitment our EAs provide each day to our schools

ASBA EDWIN PARR TEACHER AWARD 2025

- Board has approved EIPS nomination for this year's nominee, Janna MacLelland
- Janna is a first-year French Immersion teacher at Ardrossan Elementary and was selected for her commitment to educating through her exceptional learning spaces, inclusive approach to learning and innate ability to engage with children

TRANSPORTATION FEES/REGULATIONS

- Board approved 2025-2026 transportation fees on May 1
- Fees are increasing \$25 in each category in order to offset a reduction in grant funding from the AB government
- Fees are due June 30 after this date an additional \$25 fee will be applied to each category
- Transportation regulations now align with the funding manual distance eligibility criteria (students from K-Gr 6 who reside 1.6 km or greater and students in Gr7-12 who reside 2.0 km or greater from their designated or attending school)

- Once access available to Assurance Survey data, staff will incorporate the feedback to define areas to address to focus on improvement

 Archery - season wrapped May 10 with 16 students attending Nationals (hosted in Wetaskiwin)

- Band Attended ABA Festival of Bands in Red Deer on Mar 12 and 13,
